

# ACO UPDATE

## **Quality Reporting Part 2**

#### Overview

The Medicare Shared Savings Program will reward ACOs that lower their health care costs while meeting performance standards on quality of care.

#### **Quality Measures**

Thirty-four individual measures of quality performance are used to determine if an ACO qualifies for shared savings. These 34 measures span 4 quality domains: Patient Experience of Care, Care Coordination/Patient Safety, Preventive Health, and At-Risk Population.

#### Reporting

The measures are reported through a combination of a web interface designed for clinical quality measure reporting and patient experience-ofcare surveys. Scripps ACO will be reporting on behalf of Scripps ACO Participants. For reporting of clinical quality measures, Scripps ACO will work collaboratively with individual provider offices as needed including providing the CAHPS patient survey. In addition, CMS claims and administrative data are used to calculate other measures in order to reduce administrative burden. The CAHPS patient survey will ask patients to report on and evaluate their health care experiences. For performance year 2017, quality reporting will be initiated in Fall 2017 with the CAHPS patient survey and will be completed during the first quarter of calendar year 2018.
